Loganville Borough Mayor's Report – June 2024

 - Meetings/Training:

- On Friday, May 31, the Borough Council (BC) President informed me that my presence will be required at Magistrate District Court 19-3-04 for hearings on Monday, June 3 and Tuesday June 4 regarding Loganville Borough Ordinance violations.

- On Tuesday, June 4, I will take Initial Damage Reporting training at the York County Office of Emergency Management (OEM) from 10:30 AM -12:30 PM for initial local assessment of damages. It will help in determining what happened and how it has affected individuals and communities, how residential, business and infrastructure property has been affected, which areas were hardest hit, which situations must be given response priority and what types of assistance are needed (e.g., local, state, or federal). The course covers the basic responsibilities of the municipality for reporting damages to York County OEM after a disaster. Instruction will cover the collection and reporting of damages to residential dwellings and damages to infrastructure such as roads, bridges, culverts, etc. The Impact Statement will also be explained. Forms that can be used to collect the damage information are also provided. This information will be helpful in the event federal reimbursement becomes available to municipalities. This training was originally scheduled for May 21.

- Correspondence: On Friday, May 31, York County OEM sent an email regarding a forthcoming Federal EMA (FEMA) Stakeholder Preparedness Review (SPR). The FEMA SPR will assess what community responders and community organizations are capable of in any phase of an emergency. This is very detailed process allows communities to determine what they need in terms of future plans, purchasing, and coordination. More details will be provided by York County OEM at a later date.
- Miscellaneous: During the month of May, I addressed eight (8) issues of violations of the Grass and Weeds Ordinance (No. 2006-02 with the 2009-1 update). Three (3) violations were for residential properties and all were resolved after personally speaking with the residents or leaving a door hanger warning. The other five (5) violations were for commercial properties and four (4) were corrected within 24-48 hours of making contact with the property owners. The sole remaining property owners are located outside of York County and a door hanger (Thursday, May 23, 5:45 PM) and photos of it and the excessive grass height on the property were emailed to them on Friday, May 24 at 11:46 AM. The ten (10) calendar day notice per the ordinance expires at 5:45 PM, Sunday, June 2, 2024. The next step is to submit a fine letter via certified mail in the amount of \$100 plus administrative costs per the ordinance.
