Loganville Borough Mayor's Report – May 2022

Issues/Concerns/Requests:

- On Friday, April 22nd a young man from Aptive Environmental Pest Control <https://www.GoAptive.com/harrisburg> stopped by my residence to solicit. After requesting his permit and producing none, I informed him that he was in violation of the borough's solicitation ordinance (2014-03). He indicated that he'd been to other houses and no one asked him about a permit. I informed him that it would be best if he promptly left the borough. He challenged me by asking for identification. I reiterated that without a permit that both he and his company could face consequences if he continued to solicit. Perhaps we should consider getting some signs that some municipalities (e.g., Jacobus Borough) post on their boundary signposts indicating that permits are required to solicit. I notified Borough Council (BC) of his activities after he departed.

- A concerned borough resident informed me on Tuesday, April 26th and Wednesday April 27th that they observed three youth (two boys, one girl) on top of the baseball storage shed or right field dugout roofs at Goodling Community Park. I parked my car behind the park building on Wednesday around 4:15 PM so I could observe them without being seen and I saw them on the roof. By the time I prepared to leave and approach them they had gotten down and headed out of the borough on West Ore Street. I caught up with them and informed them that they shouldn't be doing this. The girl and one of the boys apologized and said they were sorry.

- Pennsylvania State Police (PSP) Report: none received
- District Court Reports: none received
- Emergency Management (EM):
 - Fire Police Requests: none received
 - Weather Emergencies: York County Office of Emergency Management (OEM) began providing National Weather Service (NWS) Weather Briefings on Sunday, April 17th for a late-season snowfall forecasted for Monday, April 18th. These were passed to BC.

- EM Coordinator (EMC): At York County OEM Quarterly EMC Training (see below), EMCs were informed that the Harris XG-15P Portable Radios that municipalities own (including Loganville Borough) will reach End Of Life (EOL) in 2026. EOL (or sunseting) means that Harris will no longer support the XG-15 family of radios in 2026. EMCs were advised to inform their municipalities to begin building budget lines and setting aside funds for replacement radios over the next four years. The current estimate for a replacement radio is \$5,000.00.
- Meetings/Training: York County OEM Quarterly EMC Training was held at the Department of Emergency Services, 120 Davies Drive, York on Wednesday, April 6th from 6:30-9:00 PM. Todd McGinnis, York County 911 Communications Radio Systems Administrator presented an excellent overview of the county's Land Mobile Radio (LMR) operations.
- Correspondence: During the Snow Emergency Declaration (SED) for WS Quinlan, a total of twenty-one vehicles were parked on borough streets, the most ever during my two plus years tenure as mayor. Sixteen Ordinance Violation Letters were mailed on March 28th. Nearly 80% of those letters have been responded to.
- Miscellaneous:
 - On Friday, April 15th I notified MetEd/FirstEnergy that the street light at the intersection of Park and West Ore Streets (259 West Ore Street, Pole No. 29058-19205) was intermittently turning on and off. FirstEnergy Lighting Request W001529891466 was generated and the light has been repaired.
 - On Saturday, April 16th I participated in the Goodling Community Park cleanup.
 - On Saturday, April 23rd I accompanied the BC President to follow up on WS Quinlan Ordinance Violation Letters. The residents that we successfully contacted were understanding and paid their fines. We also reiterated that Loganville Borough SED notification processes include posting SEDs on the four York area TV affiliates, the Loganville Borough web page and Savvy Citizen app and SED handbills at multiple, late operating Loganville retail locations.
