## Loganville Borough Mayor's Report – November 2025

**Issues/Concerns/Requests:** none

### Mayor Report Summary:

- Pennsylvania State Police (PSP) Report: none received
- District Court Reports: none received
- Emergency Management (EM):
  - Fire Police Requests: none received
  - Weather Emergencies: none
- Meetings/Training:
  - York County Office of Emergency Management (OEM) quarterly EM Coordinator (EMC) Training was held on Wednesday, October 8 from 6:00-8:00 pm. Presentations were made by the US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) and Autism York. USACE provided an overview of the Indian Rock Dam complex and explained how their notification system works with EMCs. Autism York gave a brief overview of Autism and information for EMCs and local first responders including insights on:
    - Understanding Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) and neuro-diversity
    - Strategies for effective communication and support
    - Inclusive practices in various settings
    - Real-life case studies and interactive learning opportunities.
- Correspondence: On Thursday, October 16, York County OEM informed EMCs that Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) can no longer pick up dead deer from roadways due to Chronic Wasting Disease among the deer population in our county. A Road Killed Deer (RKD) Pick Up Request Form was provided by Penn DOT to notify the Pennsylvania Game Commission (PGC) to remove RKD. I submitted the borough's first RKC Form to the PGC on Saturday, October 25 for a RKD along the west (Springfield Township) side of Park Street. During the week of October 26, the RKD was removed. If I observe or notified of RKDs in Loganville, I will submit RKD forms to the PGC for their removal.

Four of these were in the Parkview West development and 2 were on North Main Street. Both North Main Street violations (2006-2 and 2013-1) were resolved. Two of three Parkview West violations (2013-1) were resolved and one is pending. One Parkview West violation (2006-2) is also pending.

- On Wednesday, October 9 the Council Vice President sent me this message: "...received a message this afternoon from a resident named Clayton that asked if we will address an obstruction at the intersection of Ore & Locust Streets. He said there is a smaller bush that blocks view when trying to pull out. The message was hard to hear. His cell number is 717-825-8587 if you need further clarification." This was from a phone call the borough received. Here's my follow-up:

I checked the York County Property Viewer to verify the location to determine the landowner of the small bush. Afterwards I called Klayton (Amspacher) on Friday, October 10 at 8:20 am and I asked him if the bush was nearest to 103 West Ore Street (Chiropractor's office) or 1 Locust Drive. It turned out that it was not at the intersection of West Ore and Locust, but rather across the square/Main Street at the intersection of East Ore Street/PA-214 and Loucks Street. He described it as a bush on the corner by utility poles. Inquiring about the circumstances, he explained that he was coming down Loucks Street from Loganville-Springfield Elementary School where he drops his daughter off. Klayton lives in York Township. On Sunday, October 12, I went to the intersection in question and took two photos from my car. I could clearly see the East Ore Street roadway running alongside the two story, red brick building at 1 South Main St from my driver's seat. Yes utility pole(s) and the bush are there, but looking out the front passenger seat window I still had a clear view of the East Ore Street roadway. If the silver car in the 1 North Main Street driveway was not parked there, I would have been able to see even more of East Ore Street. Given these facts, I do not see the bush as a major obstruction.
