Loganville Borough Mayor's Report – July 2021

Issues/Concerns/Requests:

- On Tuesday, June 1st, the York County Office of Emergency Management (OEM) informed EM Coordinators (EMCs) that they are officially closing the COVID-19 incident. They also indicated that the Disaster Declaration (county) will remain in place for the time being. Additionally, they asked us to confirm whether we will continue to maintain our Disaster Declaration or terminate it, and inform them of our decision. *Pending confirmation from our Solicitor, I recommend that we terminate our Declaration, unless retaining it is necessary for any pending funding requests.*
- On Thursday, June 10th, a young man from Fox Pest Control www.Fox-Pest.com stopped by my residence to solicit. After requesting his permit and producing none, I informed him that he was in violation of borough solicitation ordinances and as Mayor, one of my principal duties is Law Enforcement (LE). I encouraged him to depart the borough so I wouldn't need to perform LE duties.

Mayor Report Summary:

- Pennsylvania State Police (PSP) Report: none received
- District Court Reports: none received
- Emergency Management (EM):
 - Fire Police Requests: none received
 - Weather Emergencies: York County Office of Emergency Management (OEM) provided National Weather Service (NWS) Severe Weather, Thunderstorm and Extreme Heat Advisories on 3, 10, 14, 21 and 28 June. The NWS Advisories were provided to Borough Council (BC) after receipt. Three such advisories/updates were provided on Monday, June 21st. On the afternoon of June 21st, I reported downed limbs on Park Street to the PSP and submitted an initial Borough Damage Report to York County OEM. Afterwards, I conducted a Damage Assessment by driving throughout the Borough. As a result, I provided the York County OEM individual damage reporting form to two borough residents whose trees were downed by the storm. On Monday, June 28th, the BC President informed me of a downed line in Goodling Park. Upon investigation, I found the downed line running from the MetEd/FirstEnergy Pole No. 29062-19168 (located on Park Street and the driveway entrance to the Park Building (vicinity of 33 Park Street)) to MetEd/ FirstEnergy Pole No. 29090-19165, which is on Goodling Park Grounds adjacent to the

- Weather Emergencies (cont.):

Band Stand. It was a copper cable (some wire was visible from missing insulation), approximately 3/8" in diameter, which was severed about 2/3 of the way from Park Street to the Band Stand. I reported this to MetEd/FirstEnergy (Notification/Confirmation No. 349024162) and they informed me that a crew would be out that day. An updated Borough Damage Report containing this information was also submitted to York County OEM. The line was fixed when I checked on Tuesday.

- EM Coordinator (EMC): On June 8th, York County OEM requested a list of any special events happening in our area (e.g., large (≥ 5,000 people at a time) or national or regional attention type events. Having none, I reported so on June 9th.

- Meetings/Training:

- On June 9th, York County OEM informed EMCs of Quarterly Training at the Department of Emergency Services, 120 Davies Drive, York, to be held on Wednesday, July 7th from 6:30-9:00 pm. The training topic will cover some Local EMCs providing their perspectives and experiences with Regionalization of EM Agencies (EMAs).

- Correspondence:

- The May 19th courtesy warning letter to a Loganville establishment citing Borough Ordinance 2006-02 with Revision 2009-01, *Excessive Vegetation Height*, was resolved on Sunday, June 20th when mowing was completed.
- On Friday, June 11th, I attended an Eagle Court of Honor Ceremony at Lake Redman's Kain County Park and presented a Mayoral proclamation to Borough Resident and Eagle Scout Colin Loughlin, for his Eagle Scout Project of refurbishment and repainting of the bandstand and painting the baseball diamond third baseline fence at Loganville Borough's George A. Goodling Community Park. As a Loganville Resident, he was designated a Distinguished Young Borough Resident.
